What the Bible Says About Income/Work

3. Both wealth and poverty make us prone to <u>temptation</u> to not trust God.



Philippians 4:11-13

Not that I speak from want, for I have learned to be content in whatever circumstances I am. ¹² I know how to get along with humble means, and I also know how to live in prosperity;



in any and every circumstance I have learned the secret of being filled and going hungry, both of having abundance and suffering need. ¹³ I can do all things through Him who strengthens me.



What the Bible Says About Income/Work

4. Contentment is often the secret to financial peace.

Contentment is learned.



Colossians 3:23

Whatever you do, do your work heartily, as for the Lord rather than for men,

WORK <u>HEARTILY!</u>



1. It is God's will for us to work and provide, therefore we should pray with the confidence that it is His will.

"Believe that He can,
Ask that He will,
Trust what He does,
Praise Him no matter what."

2. Encourage counselees to take employment opportunities instead of waiting for the "perfect" job.



3. Be alert to limited income being the presenting problem masking a lack of contentment.



What the Bible Says About Spending



Matthew 6:19-21

"Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal.



²⁰"But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves do not break in or steal; ²¹ for where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

1. Spend less than what you make.
Wisdom avoids debt.



What the Bible Says About Spending

Debt is often considered acceptable when:

a. The amount is <u>affordable</u> within your cash flow.

What the Bible Says About Spending

Debt is often considered acceptable when:

b. The amount of debt is less than the value of the asset. (home)

But you cannot assume the <u>future</u> of cash flow or asset value.



2. Spend in a way that leaves resources for saving and sharing.



3. Spend with a <u>prioritization</u> of needs before wants.



What the Bible Says About Spending

4. Spend with a recognition of the reality of stuff. It will rust, rot, or get ripped off. Jesus understood depreciation.

COUNSELING APPLICATION: SPENDING

3. Premarital: The couple who wants the wife to be able to be at home with the children when they are young should learn to live off ONE income.

COUNSELING APPLICATION: SPENDING

Avoid the double whammy of increased expense and decreased income.



What the Bible Says About Saving



Proverbs 6:6-8

Go to the ant, O sluggard, Observe her ways and be wise, ⁷ Which, having no chief, Officer or ruler, ⁸ Prepares her food in the summer and gathers her provision in the harvest.

What the Bible Says About Saving

2. You can never save enough, but you can save too much. We do not trust in savings, but trust in God does not preclude saving.

COUNSELING APPLICATION: SAVING

3. Premarital: If a couple lives off one income they can accumulate significant savings allowing them to wisely position themselves for a significant down payment and reasonable mortgage payment.

⁸ And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that always having all sufficiency in everything, you may have an abundance for every good deed;



¹⁰ Now He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness;



¹¹ you will be enriched in everything for all liberality, which through us is producing thanksgiving to God.



3. The emphasis of the New Testament is on generosity.



4. God promises to give seed to sowers.



5. There is a "ladder of giving integrity" in the New Testament.
